- Reviewed Freshwater Wetlands General Permit Application 7 Eastmans Road Block 739, Lots 5 & 6 Township of Parsippany. The Environmental Commission had no comment with this application.
- Reviewed Application for an Letter of Interpretation Line Verification Block 7401, Lot 2.01 and Block 7501, Lot 10 Vision Equities. Liaison Ferramosca said that a Starbucks is going back where the old fire house is located. Member Iannaccone said that this application is about the contours of the land. The Environmental Commission had no comment with this application.
- Reviewed Bowman Consulting - Notice of NJDEP Application River Park Business Center, LLC Block 3801, Lot 2, (Removal of the Eden Mill Dam). Chairman Wilson said that recently there was flooding recently and asked is there

anything going on with the site? Liaison Ferramosca said its in litigation. Chairman Wilson asked was there an environmental clean-up? Liaison Ferramosca said a lot was invested in a clean-up. Liaison Ferramosca said once we lose the dam we lose the lagoons and it will fill in and buildings can be built.
