A PROCLAMATION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HANOVER RECOGNIZING THE CAREER AND VOLUNTEER MEN AND WOMEN OF

THE CEDAR KNOLLS FIRE DEPARTMENT FIRST AID SQUAD FOR THEIR PROFESSIONALISM AND DEDICATION AND IN HONOR OF RECEIVING THE PRESTIGIOUS 2013 DISTINGUISHED COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD CONFERRED BY THE ASSOCIATION FOR RETARDED CITIZENS/MORRIS COUNTY CHAPTER, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Cedar Knolls Fire Department was organized on September 11, 1919 and subsequently in 1941, the Fire Department inaugurated a first aid squad for the Hanover Township community; and

WHEREAS, since its formation, the Cedar Knolls Fire Department First Aid Squad has excelled in providing outstanding emergency medical services to the residents and businesses of Hanover Township; and

WHEREAS, in this regard, municipalities such as Hanover Township rely on the career employees and volunteer members of the community who dedicate themselves in providing primary care and treatment as the first responders to the scene of a critically ill or injured person; and

WHEREAS, in 2012 alone, the Cedar Knolls Fire Department First Aid Squad responded to well over 1,000 calls for medical assistance; and

WHEREAS, the members of the First Aid Squad are well trained to handle a wide variety of medical problems facing divergent age groups including individuals with special needs; and

WHEREAS, the Association for Retarded Citizens/Morris County Chapter, New Jersey operates five (5) facilities in Hanover Township in providing specialized care for developmentally disabled persons; and

WHEREAS, on numerous occasions, the Cedar Knolls Fire Department First Aid Squad is called upon to provide medical assistance to those individuals residing in a group home environment; and

WHEREAS, on those occasions when individuals in a group home setting require first aid assistance, the first responders calm fears, give assurance that they are on the scene to help, and provide compassionate and prompt treatment to persons in need of aid; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the essential emergency medical services provided by the Cedar Knolls Fire Department First Aid Squad to the residents and staff of group home facilities located in Hanover Township, the Association for Retarded Citizens/Morris County Chapter, New Jersey has chosen the First Aid Squad to receive The ARC's 2013 Distinguished Community Service Award; and

WHEREAS, V.F.W. **Buddy Poppies** are assembled by disabled veterans, and the proceeds of this worthy fund-raising campaign are used exclusively for the benefit of disabled and needy veterans, and the widows and orphans of deceased veterans; and

WHEREAS, the basic purpose of the annual distribution of **Buddy Poppies** by the Flight Officer Robert C. Gulick Post #5351 of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, is eloquently reflected in the desire to "Honor the Dead by Helping the Living".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hanover, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

WHEREAS, the **Poppy**, as a memorial flower for the American war dead, is a tradition which began in the years following the First World War; and

WHEREAS, Veterans returning to their homes in this country after World War I remembered the wild **poppies** which lined the devastated battlefields of France and Flanders Field; and

WHEREAS, the soldiers of all nations came to look upon this flower as a living symbol of their dead comrades' sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, today that little symbolic flower continues to pay tribute to those millions who have answered the call to arms and made the supreme sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, the **Poppy** is more than a symbol, it is a source of hope and inspiration for many in our nation, as disabled veterans receive financial assistance for making poppies by hand as part of their therapy; and

WHEREAS, the **Poppy Month** program is designated exclusively for assistance to veterans and their families in time of need; and

WHEREAS, the American Legion Auxiliary adopted the Poppy as its memorial flower which pays tribute to the war dead and aids the living veterans and their families; and

WHEREAS, the **American Legion Auxiliary** has pledged to remind America annually of this debt through distribution of the red crepe paper poppy.

Member Coppola offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HANOVER RESCINDING ITS PRIOR AUTHORIZATION FOR THE PLANNING BOARD TO CONDUCT AN INVESTIGATION PURSUANT TO NJ.S.A. 40A:12A-6 TO DETERMINE IF THE CONDITIONS ON LOT 9 IN BLOCK 4001 MEET THE CRITERIA IN N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 FOR DESIGNATION AS AN AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, at the request of the Jewish Community Housing Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "JCHC"), the Township Committee by resolution adopted on April 25, 2013 authorized a study by the Hanover Township Planning Board to determine if the conditions on Lot 9 in Block 4001 on the Township's Tax Map satisfied the statutory criteria in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 to support a finding that said property qualified as an "area in need of redevelopment;" and

WHEREAS, the request was made by the JCHC in order to assist its efforts to obtain low income housing tax credits through the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency, as described in the April 25, 2013 resolution; and

WHEREAS, the tax credit application also required that the applicant have preliminary site plan approval prior to the filing deadline for the tax credit application, which for this year was on June 21, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee retained a consultant to perform the study to investigate whether Lot 9 in Block 4001 met the statutory criteria for an area in need of redevelopment, which investigation was summarized in a report to the Township's Planning Board; and

WHEREAS, at its May 14, 2013 work-session meeting, the Planning Board raised questions concerning the findings in the report, which questions have not been resolved; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the adoption of the Township Committee's April 25, 2013 resolution, JCHC filed an application for preliminary site plan approval with the Township's Planning Board, but said application was withdrawn by JCHC prior to the public hearing, which had been scheduled for May 21, 2013; and

WHEREAS, both the unresolved questions concerning the redevelopment area investigation and the withdrawal of the site plan application by JCHC make it impossible for JCHC to meet the June filing deadline for tax credit applications; and

WHEREAS, given the foregoing circumstances and the uncertainty regarding future development of the property, the Township Committee feels that the process would best be served by rescinding its prior authorization for a study to investigate whether Lot 9 in Block 4001 meets the criteria for an area in need of redevelopment.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hanover in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The prior authorization to conduct an investigation concerning redevelopment for Lot 9 in Block 4001 is hereby rescinded.
- 2. The Hanover Township Planning Board and all staff and professional consultants are hereby directed to stop any studies, research, analysis and other work related to the redevelopment area designation of Lot 9 in Block 4001.
- 3. The Township Committee reserves its rights under the law to authorize the same or another redevelopment area study at such time and under such conditions that it deems appropriate.
- 4. That certified copies of this resolution shall be transmitted to the Executive Director of the Jewish Community Housing Corporation, the Township Attorney, the Secretary to the Planning Board and the Township's Professional Planner.

Member Cappola offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HANOVER REJECTING THE LOWEST BIDDER DM FERNANDES CONTRACTS, LLC AND AWARDING THE CONTRACT TO THE SECOND LOWEST RESPONSIBLE AND RESPONSIVE BIDDER STANZIALE

CONSTRUCTION LLC FOR THE RESURFACING OF THE ENTIRE LENGTH OF WARREN STREET

- WHEREAS, the Township of Hanover intends to resurface the entire length of Warren Street in the Whippany Section of the Township; and
- **WHEREAS,** pursuant to authorization by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Hanover ("Township"), the Township received bid proposals on April 2, 2013 for the "Resurfacing of Warren Street"; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Township Committee find and declare that nine (9) bid proposals were received, opened and read on April 2, 2013; and
- **WHEREAS,** the apparent lowest responsible and responsive bidder for the streets set forth above was DM Fernandes Contracts, LLC in the amount of \$122,929.50; and
- WHEREAS, on April 11, 2013, the Township Committee approved a resolution awarding the "Resurfacing of Warren Street" to the apparent lowest responsible and responsive bidder, DM Fernandes Contracts, LLC; and
- **WHEREAS,** following the award of the bid, a review of all the bid documents was conducted by the Township; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Township Committee find and declare that the low bid submitted by DM Fernandes Contracts, LLC in the amount of \$122,929.50 is non-compliant as it provides fraudulent information regarding ownership of the company; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Mayor and Township Committee find and declare that for the foregoing reason, the bid from DM Fernandes Contracts, LLC shall be rejected as non-responsive and non-compliant; and
- **WHEREAS**, the next low bid was received from Stanziale Construction LLC in the amount of \$131,517.50;
- WHEREAS, the Township Engineer, acting within his authority and in conformity with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. has carefully examined all the bid documents submitted by Stanziale Construction LLC for the entire length of Warren Street; and
- WHEREAS, as a result of his review, and a legal review by the Township Attorney, the Township Engineer has determined that Stanziale Construction LLC is in total conformance with the Township's March, 2013 Specification and Supplementary Specification and that the bid proposal does not include any exceptions, deviations or deficiencies; therefore, Stanziale Construction LLC is deemed the second lowest responsible and responsive bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Committee have determined that an award of the contract to the second lowest bidder is in the best interests of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Municipal Finance Officer has certified that sufficient funds have been appropriated and are available in the 2013 Current Fund Budget – Road Construction and Reconstruction Account for the resurfacing project set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hanover, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. That the low bid received on April 2, 2013 from DM Fernandes Contracts LLC for "Resurfacing of Warren Street" is hereby rejected for the reasons expressed above herein.
- 2. That the contract for "Resurfacing of Warren Street" is hereby awarded to the second lowest responsible and responsive bidder, Stanziale Construction, LLC located at P.O. Box 2597 in Bloomfield, New Jersey 07003.
- 3. That the Mayor and Township Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract for the aforesaid "Resurfacing of Warren Street" with Stanziale Construction, LLC, upon submission of all required documentation, including an executed Power of Attorney dated as of the issuance of the bid bond and Consent of Surety authorizing the attorney-in-fact to bind the Surety, by the said successful bidder.
- 4. Upon commencement of the work, Stanziale Construction, LLC shall be responsible in providing sufficient personnel and to continue in completing the project in an expeditious fashion all in accordance with requirements of the Township's Specification and Supplementary Specification. In addition, Stanziale Construction, LLC shall be required to submit a satisfactory work or project schedule to the Township Engineer.

WHEREAS, while the Township's web site provides important information to its residents and the public in general, a need exists to redesign and convert it into a format that is easy to navigate for users and provide other features related to site content, special features overall maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the Township's Department of Administration prepared a Request For Proposal/Request For Quotation (RFP/RFQ) describing the minimum requirements for redesigning the Township's web site; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law at N.J.S.A. 11-6.1, the Township solicited written proposals and quotations from three (3) vendors who have demonstrated experience and expertise in redesigning, developing and hosting web sites for both private and public sector organizations; and

WHEREAS, based on the Township's RFP/RFQ, the Township received three (3) proposals and quotations from the following vendors:

3.	CD Meyer Inc	11,950.00 ; and
2.	CivicPlus	24,161.00; and
1.	Netalytical	\$25,000.00;

WHEREAS, the Department of Administration carefully reviewed the response from each vendor as to the scope of services to be provided to the Township including cost; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6.1, the Department of Administration has determined that the proposal and quotation submitted by CD Meyer Inc. is most advantageous to the Township in terms of the services to be rendered including costs for a twelve (12) month period; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Business Administrator/ Township Clerk, in his role as the Township's Qualified Purchasing Agent that the governing body authorize the award of a contract to CD Meyer Inc. in the form of a Purchase Order in an amount not to exceed \$11,950.00 for the purpose of providing web site design, development and hosting services as described in full in CD Meyer's proposal and quotation received on April 16, 2013 which proposal and quotation is attached hereto and made a part of this resolution as if set forth in full; and

WHEREAS, CD Meyer Inc. will perform the web site redesign project services during the period commencing June 1, 2013 and ending May 31, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hanover in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. The governing body hereby approves and authorizes retaining the services of Christopher Meyer and CD Meyer Inc. located at 91 Clinton Road, Suite 2C in Fairfield, New Jersey 07004 for the purpose of redesigning the Township's current web site which services shall include hosting, training and other related technical support services which are described in full in the CD Meyer Inc. proposal received on April 16, 2013 which proposal is attached hereto and made a part of this resolution as if set forth in full.
- 2. The Business Administrator/Township Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to issue a Purchase Order in an amount not to exceed \$11,950.00 which Purchase Order shall act as a contract between the Township and **CD Meyer Inc.** in performing the web site redesign, development and hosting for the period beginning June 1, 2013 and ending on May 31, 2014.
- 3. The Township's Chief Municipal Finance Officer has certified that sufficient funds have been appropriated and are available in the Township's 2013 Current Fund Budget, Administrative and Executive, Line Item No. 123-0001-354 for the web site redesign project described herein.
- 4. That certified copies of this resolution shall be transmitted to the Township's Chief Municipal Finance Officer, the Township's IT Specialist and **CD Meyer Inc.** for reference and information purposes.

WHEREAS, the Southeast Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority (SMCMUA) with offices located at 19 Saddle Road in the Cedar Knolls Section is the owner of property located at 10 Baird Place in the Whippany Section of the Township on which a 140' water tank is located; and

WHEREAS, New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC is a federally licensed communications carrier and the contract lessee of the 10 Baird Place property owned by the SMCMUA; and

WHEREAS, on September 18, 2008, the Board of Adjustment granted site plan and variance approval to **New Cingular Wireless PCS**, **LLC** as the applicant and developer to install a cell site consisting of the placement of twelve (12) panel antennas at 150' on the 140' water tank including telecommunications equipment, cabinets and a federally mandated GPS antenna at the base of the tank on the ground next to the water tank as well as the installation of a fence and landscaping on the Baird Place property designated as Lot 6 in Block 7702 as set forth on the Tax Map of the Township of Hanover; and

WHEREAS, Conti Communications, Inc. submitted a total performance guarantee on behalf of **New Cingular Wireless PCS**, **LLC** in the form of an \$11,244.00 cash bond; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the November 11, 2010 Developer's Agreement, New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC has satisfactorily completed the site improvements at 10 Baird Place; and

WHEREAS, in a letter dated May 21, 2013 to the Mayor and Township

Committee, the Township Engineer has advised the governing body that the Developer has satisfactorily completed all of the required site improvements; and

WHEREAS, in the same letter, the Township Engineer recommends the release of the total cash performance guarantee in the amount of \$11,244.00 plus a portion of the interest in accordance with P.L. 1985, c. 315 to Conti Communications, **Inc.** as well as the balance of the remaining Engineering inspection fees.

- **WHEREAS,** in accordance with the Township's job application process, the four (4) applicants were initially interviewed by the Construction Official and the Assistant Business Administrator on April 30 and May 7, 2013; and
- **WHEREAS,** the applicants were rated on their employment experience and expertise and their overall skills and abilities to perform the duties and tasks of the positions set forth above; and
- **WHEREAS**, subsequently, the Business Administrator and Construction Official conducted a second interview with the finalist on May 20, 2013; and
- WHEREAS, as a result of the second interview with the final candidate, the Business Administrator and Construction Official believe that **Michael J. Wallace** residing at 5 Gails Court in Highland Lakes, New Jersey 07422 possesses the necessary experience, skills and expertise to assume the job duties and responsibilities of part-time Electrical Sub Code Official/Electrical Inspector/Assistant Zoning Officer/Property Maintenance Inspector; and
- WHEREAS, depending on the needs of the Building Department, the Construction Official estimates that **Mr. Wallace** will be required to work twenty-four (24) hours a week up to a maximum of twenty-eight (28) hours in any week; and
- WHEREAS, in accordance with Township policy as it pertains to part-time employees, Michael Wallace shall not be eligible to receive any prior service credit or receive or accrue any paid vacations, holiday pay, sick leave, or health and dental benefits coverage of any kind whatsoever in his part-time position as Electrical Sub Code Official/Electrical Inspector/Assistant Zoning Officer/Property Maintenance Officer.
