INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE NO. 23-2017

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HANOVER IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF NEW LETTERING FOR THE FACADES OF THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING AND POLICE HEADQUARTERS, EXTERIOR AND INTERIOR MUNICIPAL BUILDING DIRECTIONAL SIGNAGE AND A NEW FREESTANDING, LED DIGITAL MESSAGE BOARD AND FURTHER APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$150,000.00 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF 2017 AND ALL PRIOR YEARS FOR THE FINANCING OF THE IMPROVEMENTS DESCRIBED HEREIN

WHEREAS, a need exists to replace the lettering on the facades of the Municipal Building and Police Headquarters as well as directional signage along the shoulder of the main driveway to the Municipal Building, Whippanong Library and Police Headquarters and interior directional signage for the Municipal Building; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide residents and members of the public with information concerning upcoming Township programs and events, the Township also desires to construct an LED digital message board at the entrance to the Municipal Building Campus at the intersection of Town Hall Drive and North Jefferson Road; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Township Committee to authorize the purchase and installation of the lettering, signage and message board described above and appropriate necessary funds from the 2017 Capital Improvement Fund for the financing of the project improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hanover in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. The governing body hereby authorizes the following capital improvements for the Municipal Building Campus:

- A. The purchase and installation of new lettering for the facades of the Municipal Building and Police Headquarters;
- B. The purchase and installation of new directional signage to be erected along the shoulder of the main driveway entrance to the Municipal Building Campus; and
- C. The purchase and installation of new interior directional signage for the Municipal Building.
- D. The construction and installation of a new LED digital message board sign at the main driveway entrance to the Municipal Building Campus at the intersection of Town Hall Drive and North Jefferson Road.

Section 2. In accordance with the drawings, plans, specifications and contract documents, prepared by Parette Somjen, professional architects licensed by the State of New Jersey, the Township Engineer is authorized and directed to advertise for the receipt of sealed competitive bids for each of the improvements set forth in Section 1. above, all in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law at N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.

Section 3. For the financing of the capital improvements described in Section 1. above, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$150,000.00 from the Capital Improvement Fund of 2017 and all prior years.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.

The Ordinance will be further considered for Public Hearing on November 20th at 8:30 pm and at that time any person wishing to be heard concerning the Ordinance will

be given the opportunity to be heard. The Ordinance and Notice of Introduction will be published in full in the Daily Record in accordance with the law.

ONLY ON SUNDAYS, NOVEMBER 19, 2017 AND DECEMBER 24 AND 31, 2017

WHEREAS, Ocean Wine & Spirits, Inc. has been granted a Plenary Retail Distribution License, License No. 1412-44-027-066 to operate a liquor store in the Township of Hanover located at 34-A Sylvan Way, Parsippany (mailing address); and

WHEREAS, Ocean Wine & Spirits, Inc. will trade as Wegmans Wine, Liquor & Beer at the location set forth above; and

WHEREAS, in a letter received on October 4, 2017 addressed to Mayor Ronald F. Francioli, the Manager of **Ocean Wine & Spirits, Inc.** is requesting that the Township Committee grant permission to open the liquor store at 9:00 a.m. only on Sundays, November 19, 2017 and December 24 and 31, 2017 as these three (3) days are considered the busiest days of the entire year due to the holiday season; and

WHEREAS, Section 82-3.B. entitled "Hours" under Chapter 82 of the Code of the Township entitled Alcoholic Beverages prohibits the holders of a Plenary Retail Distribution License from selling any alcoholic beverages on licensed premises, including but not limited to wine, beer, packaged goods in original containers and spirituous liquors, between the hours of 10:00 p.m. on Saturdays to 1:00 p.m. on Sundays; and

WHEREAS, the letter from **Ocean Wine & Spirits, Inc.** was reviewed and discussed by the governing body with the Township Attorney during its October 12, 2017 conference work session; and

WHEREAS, as a result of that review, the Township Committee decided to permit **Ocean Wine & Spirits, Inc.** to open its store to customers starting at 9:00 a.m. only on Sundays, November 19 and December 24 and 31, 2017 until closing time at 10:00 p.m. in order to sell packaged alcoholic beverages on the licensed premises.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hanover in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. **Ocean Wine & Spirits, Inc.**, trading as Wegmans Wine, Liquor & Beer, the holder of Plenary Retail Distribution License No. 1412-44-027-006, located at 34-A Sylvan Way in the Township of Hanover is granted permission to open the liquor store only on Sundays, November 19 and December 24 and 31, 2017 starting at 9:00 a.m. until closing time at 10:00 p.m. in order to sell packaged alcoholic beverages on the licensed premises. A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HANOVER GRANTING PERMISSION TO VILLAGE SUPER MARKET OF NJ LP TRADING AS "THE VILLAGE LIQUOR STORE", TO SELL PACKAGED ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE SHOP RITE SUPERMARKET LOCATED AT 178 EAST HANOVER AVENUE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HANOVER STARTING AT 9:00 A.M. ONLY ON SUNDAYS, NOVEMBER 19, 2017 AND DECEMBER 24 AND 31, 2017

WHEREAS, Village Super Market of NJ LP has been granted a Plenary Retail Distribution License, License No. 1412-44-009-008 to sell packaged alcoholic beverages trading as "**The Village Liquor Store**"; and

WHEREAS, "The Village Liquor Store" is located within the Shop Rite Supermarket at 178 East Hanover Avenue in the Cedar Knolls Section of Hanover Township; and

WHEREAS, consistent with this prior decision, the Township Committee also grants permission to Village Super Market of NJ LP trading as "The Village Liquor Store" to open its store at 9:00 a.m. until closing time at 10:00 p.m. only on Sundays November 19, 2017 and December 24 and 31, 2017 in order to sell packaged alcoholic beverages to customers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hanover in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 198-2017

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE AUTHORIZING THE SPONSORSHIP OF THE 2018 SKI AND SNOWBOARD SEASON PROGRAM BY THE DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION AND PARK ADMINISTRATION FOR THE TOWNSHIP'S MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS AT SHAWNEE MOUNTAIN SKI AREA IN SHAWNEE ON DELAWARE, PENNSYLVANIA BASED ON THE UNIT PRICE RATES AND SKI AREA CONDITIONS

WHEREAS, there exists a need to provide the Township's middle school students with a ski and snowboard program that will offer the most advantageous ski and snowboard conditions for the more advanced student and sufficient slope conditions and expert training and supervision by the resort; and

WHEREAS, although the Township's attorney has rendered a legal opinion that while the ski and snowboard program packages may in fact fall within the category of an Extraordinary, Unspecifiable Service, it was also the Township Attorney's opinion that since the funds expended for the payment of the ski and snowboard program trips do not arise from tax dollars or revenues collected by the Township but are funds provided by the youth which pay for the ski/snowboard packages, that the sponsorship and implementation of the program are not controlled under the Local Public Contracts Law; and

WHEREAS, although this legal opinion has been rendered, this resolution serves to memorialize the actions of the Township in making every attempt to comply with the requirements of the Local Public Contracts Law in the award of this service contract; and

WHEREAS, because of the closure of the Craigmear Ski Lodge, the Board of Recreation Commissioners has carefully reviewed the rates of, and conditions at one (1) ski area and recommends that based on price and ski and snowboard area conditions, the Township continue to conduct its ski and snowboard program for middle school students at the Shawnee Mountain Ski area located at Shawnee on Delaware, Pennsylvania 18356.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hanover in the County of Morris as follows:

- 1. OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Gallagher: This Saturday is the ten year anniversary of one-day-one-school it's going to be at Hanover Park High School and we are ready to go. We have a lot of people ready to work, a lot of companies making big contributions and we are bringing back the bar-b-que aspect of our event. Godfather pizza is donating 25 pizza's and I can go down the list, it's going to be a great event and everybody is welcome and everybody can man the grill with us. Very excited about bringing back the bar-b-que aspect.

Monday, November 6 at 7:00pm School and Park Traffic Safety is going to have a public forum at Whippany Park High School. We will put something out publicly but we would love to see everybody there to come share with us what they are seeing and some of their traffic concerns in and around any of our schools and parks.

November 14 we are having a program that I announced last time, it's not a lot of fun but we believe it is important. The Morris County Sheriff's Department is going to host, right here in our Community Center a program on how to best protect your kids against abduction, abuse and sexual abuse; it's a three hour program and it's not going to be fun, but a lot of us have seen it and Hanover Township wants it here and it's going to be here and we love to see you there.

The stone restorations are moving along nicely as well as the bronze plaques for those stones that are in really bad shape.

Veteran's Alliance there is a breakfast on November 5th over at the Community Center if anyone is interested please stop in, it supports the Veteran's. If you are a Vet it is free and if you are not it's a very nominal fee.

There is also a dedication at 3:00 right next to the Library for a plaque that is going to memorialize Slattery. But he lost his life in Vietnam we are going to have a monument dedicated in his honor and it's being prepared by the Marine Corp League, so that is November 5th at 3:00pm.

Also on November 9th the Committee is going to get a little presentation of the Police's new 9-1-1 system. It's a state of the art system, and we have been looking to put this in the budget for the last several years and thank goodness we were able to do it this past year because our system was starting to become antiquated. The new system has been installed and we will be getting a demonstration on the 9th.

Lastly, the Fire Department has been doing some demonstrations; we had a breakfast at the Presbyterian Church in Whippany on what to do in the event of a storm, all the safety precautions, there is also going to be a notice out. They did one recently at the Community Center unfortunately the turnout was not what they hoped for. So

they are coming up with a date for another one. We will put it on Facebook so everyone can be aware of it.
