


During calendar year 2016, Jersey Central Power & Light will perform vegetation management work along the Stoney Brook transmission lines (refer to the attached drawings). JCP&L has retained the services of a professional tree company to perform the work. Federal and state regulations require JCP&L to properly maintain transmission lines in order to provide safe and reliable operation of the transmission system. Vegetation maintenance involves identifying tall-growing vegetation and trees located within the transmission rights-of-way and removing those that interfere or may potentially interfere with the operation of the transmission facilities. Trees adjacent to the right-of-way that are unhealthy, leaning, or significantly encroaching the corridor also could be targeted for removal.

The work described above will be done manually by tree crews or mechanically using a helicopter equipped with an aerial saw (see attached photos). Branches that fall onto access roads, agricultural fields or in streams during the manual or aerial pruning operation will be cleaned up, or moved to adjacent wooded areas by ground crews shortly after the pruning is performed. The stumps/stubble or cleared vegetation will be treated with an EPA-registered herbicide to minimize re-sprouting that typically follows mechanical removal.



JC, Stoneybrook-Morristown 230kV_Map 1


